

Mayfly-Olive

Find their 3 tails and note their darting swimming behaviour



Cased caddis fly

These larvae make a home from tiny stones, twigs or leaves. Wait and see their head pop out



leech

Look out for their interesting movement. These will not suck your blood! They feed on detritus or invertebrates



bloodworm

These live in any kind of water habitat







True Mayfly

Impressive creatures that only live in clean water. Look for their 3 tails and feathery gills. Find out about their lifecycle.



freshwater shrimp

often abundent in chalk streams but an indicator of clean water.



caddis fly

note their squirmy swimming and the hooks at the end of the tail



Ramshorn snail

A flat small snail



damselfly nymph

A large invertebrate which will turn into the beautiful blue flying damselflies
